The month of March has been full of activity! We spent the first two weeks in Jacksonville, Florida. I made my yearly pilgrimage to Mayo Clinic where I had another CT scan of my lungs and an MRI of my brain.

My pulmonary doctor saw a few more "nodules" in my lungs, but since I have not had any disturbing symptoms from the disease, he again said that he doesn't want to put me on medication because it is very toxic, and as long as I am feeling well that he is not going to treat it. He wants to see me in one year.

My neurosurgeon said that the tumor hasn't changed, so he wants another MRI in one year. If there is still no change, then he will check it every two years.

So, I am happy and thanking God for that good report.

While in Jacksonville, I spoke and showed a power point presentation to the American Business Women's Association meeting. They really enjoyed seeing the pictures of our work in Bali, and were very disturbed about the large number of orphans there. I am also disturbed about it, and I really feel that God wants us to build a children's home. I know that this is a big challenge, but we serve a big God. We must reach these children of Bali. Sometimes the need overwhelms me. And the thought of trying to raise money to build a children's home scares and depresses me, but when God gives a vision, He expects us to rally to the challenge. I know that we can build a building for about \$50,000 that will house around 50 children.....\$1,000 per child....for a home. Can you imagine it? God tells us in the Bible that man can do whatever he imagines to do.

I saw so many friends in Jacksonville that I haven't seen for many years. It was quite a homecoming time.

Two days after returning home, Bill had surgery to repair a hernia. It was an old one that had been repaired many years ago in Australia, and then it ruptured again. The recuperation has been much worse this time because the doctor had to make a large incision and go through scar tissue. Bill has been very sore and in quite a bit of pain. I have been carrying all of his meals to him, so he doesn't have to go up and down stairs. Now, after 10 days, I have declared him well enough....in spite of a lot of discomfort....to come to the table! I don't want him to get too used to a good thing here!!

It wasn't enough that my husband was immobile....then my good friend died! I said goodnight to her.....my computer....one night and the next morning, she refused to start up! I thought she had died, but praise the Lord, the computer doctor was able to replace her power control box and resurrect her. I was so thankful.

Someone stole my web site domain.....www.LifewithLaMoin.com. They put the site up for auction, and it was going to cost me \$300 to get it back (which I wasn't about to pay).....but my good friend and computer guru waited until the deadline this past week, and was able to retrieve it! Praise the Lord. That web site is in all of my books and on our stationery. He has to completely reprogram it, but it will be up and running soon. You can follow our activities there on my blog.
